"A Shout of Shameless Joy?" Luke 1:5-25, 39-45

Elizabeth quietly rejoices with a prayer of shameless joy!

"The Lord has done this for me . . . and has taken away my disgrace from among the people." Luke 1:25

Elizabeth will no longer be considered a shameful <u>nobody</u>.

Elizabeth herself will no longer have to live with a sense of shame.

Elizabeth shouts with ecstatic joy as she greets Mary and her unborn child -- who is the Savior of the world!

"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth . . . shouted" Luke 1:41

She shouts . . . because this unborn child in Mary's womb will take away the guilt and shame of sin that clings to us.

She shouts . . . because this unborn child in Mary's womb means we will no longer have to hide from God in guilty shame.

"Your life is now hidden with Christ in God." Colossians 3:3

Elizabeth rejoices that the Holy Spirit enables her to recognize the movement of her own unborn child as a leap of joy.

"As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy." Luke 1:43

This leap of joy in the womb of Elizabeth is the first response of joyful joy in a joyless world.

The leap of joy by her unborn child is the beginning of a celebration by all those who rejoice that God has come to live with those whom the world wants to shame as foolish.
